

2021 Fall Hammer-In

Our demonstrator for the Fall Hammer-In is Dick Sargent from Vermont. Dick has been smithing for 50 years and is a great source of metalsmithing knowledge. He began blacksmithing at Old Sturbridge Village, in Massachusetts. In the mid 1970s, he and Tony Millham ran Star Forge on a dock in Newport, Rhode Island, where they made "a prodigious amount" of reproduction period hardware used in the restoration of many period homes in the town.

A master Blacksmith, Dick has demonstrated and taught workshops nationally. For a number of years, he ran the Blacksmithing program at Peters Valley. Over the years. Dick has focused on high-end architectural ironwork and reproductions of historic ironwork and hardware. Dick's approach to blacksmithing is very practical. His thought process leads him to an understanding of the way the work was likely done by the smiths of centuries ago.

Some of the topics he will cover over the weekend will be: Layout: tooling and methods; discussion and demo of special tooling for railings; a practical method for forging angled tenons on stair runs; sinking and shaping hollow forms in sheet steel, useful for ladles, frying pans and more. Dick will cover a wide range of smithing topics and said he will make time for questions and requests.

Don't forget to bring items (shop related or not) for the Iron-in-the-Hat Lottery, our after lunch fundraiser. If you can take the time, make an entry for the Forging Contest. And also, bring some examples of your work for the display table. Remember that it is about sharing your joy of shaping steel and making things, so all levels of work are welcome.






